Travel Photography - What is it?

Travel photography: May involve the documentation of an area's landscape, people, cultures, customs and history. – *Wikipedia*

A travel photo: An image that expresses the feeling of a time and place, portrays a land, its people, or a culture in its natural state, and **has no geographical limitations**. – *Old PSA*

Timing of Activities



Mt. Hood, Oregon

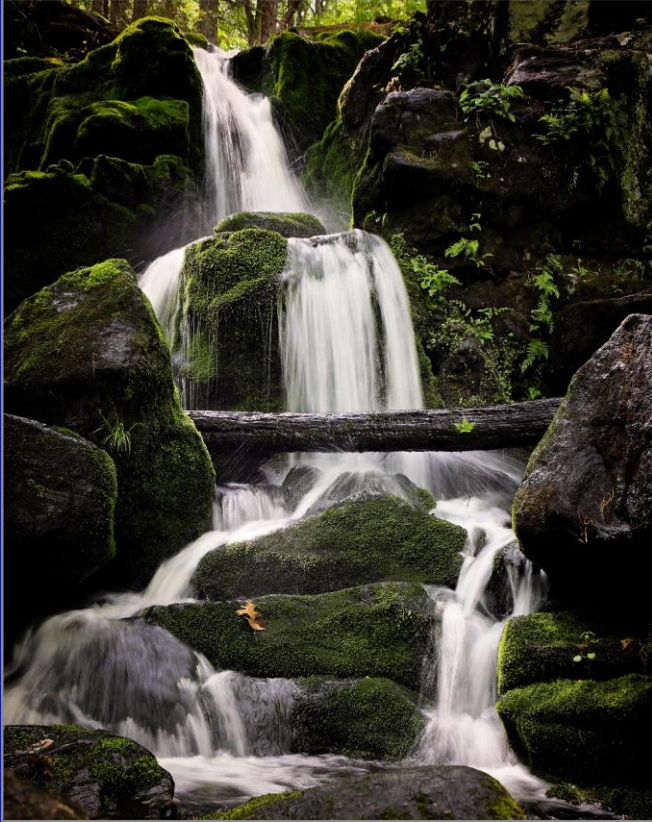

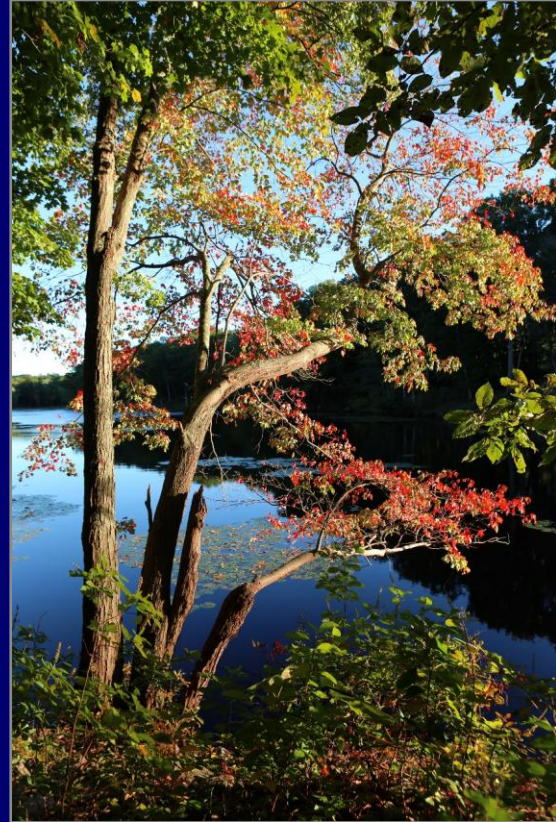

What Equipment Should I Bring?

- Camera and/or phone. The best camera is the one you have with you!
- Lenses: We use 24-70mm or 24-105mm. A mid-range 70-200mm is nice too. A 100-400mm or 100-500mm+ if shooting birds. A wide angle is good for areas like the Grand Canyon.
- Extra memory cards, spare batteries and/or charger, and foreign adapter plugs.
- Consider bringing a laptop, tablet, external hard drive or some device to backup your photos.
- Travel Tripod (optional, but nice). Consider for night photography, long exposures, HDR, or focus stacking. Or, look around for a flat rock, window ledge, post, etc. for some stability.

What else should I bring?

- Backpack/Large Purse/Camera Bag – Something for extra gear in the car vs. Carrying around
- Clothes to fit the climate: Parkas & snow boots vs. swimsuits & flipflops. (Think layers and good walking shoes!)
- Wallet – Identification, Cash, Credit Cards
- Phone
- Glasses if needed

Have a “Go Bag” Ready!

- Travel size Toiletries for things you normally use – Examples: Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Dental Floss, Shampoo, Lotion, Deodorant, Hairbrush, Comb, Fingernail clippers, Q-tips, Make-up, Razor, Sunscreen, etc.
- Medicine & Travel Kit – Tylenol, Antacid, Diarrhea medicine, Antibiotics, Band-aids, Sewing kit, Safety pins, Ear plugs, etc.
- Ziplock bags to keep things together, prevent leaks, or to keep things dry.
- Garbage bags for dirty laundry, shoes or misc. items.
- Laundry soap, wire hangers, binder clips/clothespins to hang wet clothes.
- Small umbrella and/or compact raincoat. Big garbage bag = Raincoat!
- Small Backpack/Small duffle bag/Garbage bag. Pack at the top of carryon to put essentials inside in case the carryon needs to be checked.
- Check lists. Make a list of what needs done before leaving the house and list what you want to bring with you.

How much luggage can you manage?

- You probably don't need as much stuff as you think. Most places have stores if needed.
- Often cars in other countries are smaller than ours. Will it all fit?
- Do not pack your camera, lenses, medications or documents in your checked bags!
- Put undergarments, shorts, and t-shirts (change of clothes) around your camera gear.
- Put a copy of your itinerary, lodging info and your cell phone number in each bag.

Realize you need to be flexible

- Build in some flexibility to your schedule to alter days if needed.
- Schedule your “Must Sees” early in your trip.
- Have a back up plan in case you have bad weather the day you were going to visit a place outside.

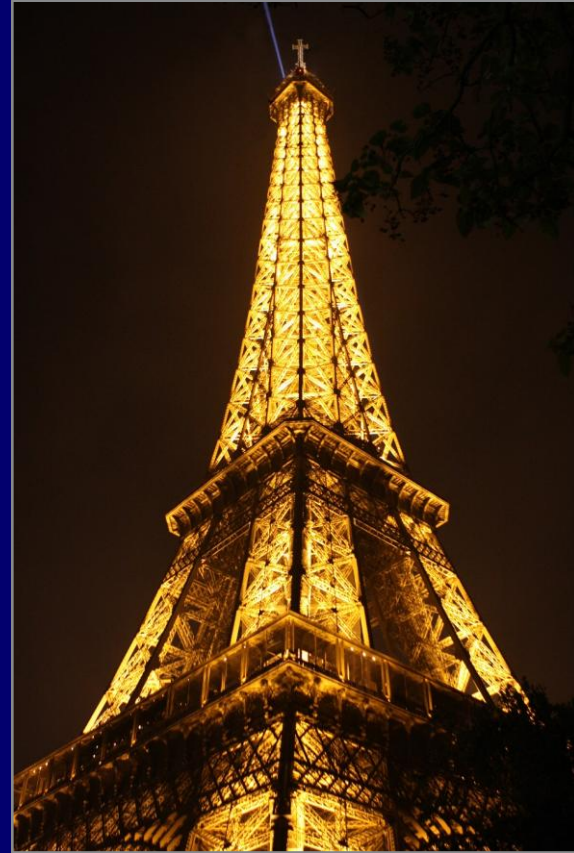

Navigating - Preparation



Venice, Italy

- Look at maps before you leave home.
- Bring a list of your hotels and must sees with the addresses listed in the native language and a street map where they are located.
- You can use these maps to point to the place on the list or map you want to go when asking for directions or telling a Taxi driver where to take you.
- If you are renting a car, many rentals are a standard manual transmission (Stick shift). If you can't drive a stick shift, be sure to ask for an automatic when making your reservation.

Practice with your camera before you leave

Don't miss the once in a lifetime photo because you can't figure out how to quickly set your camera to the right settings.



Ok, if needed, quickly switch to “green” or “auto” mode so you at least capture it.

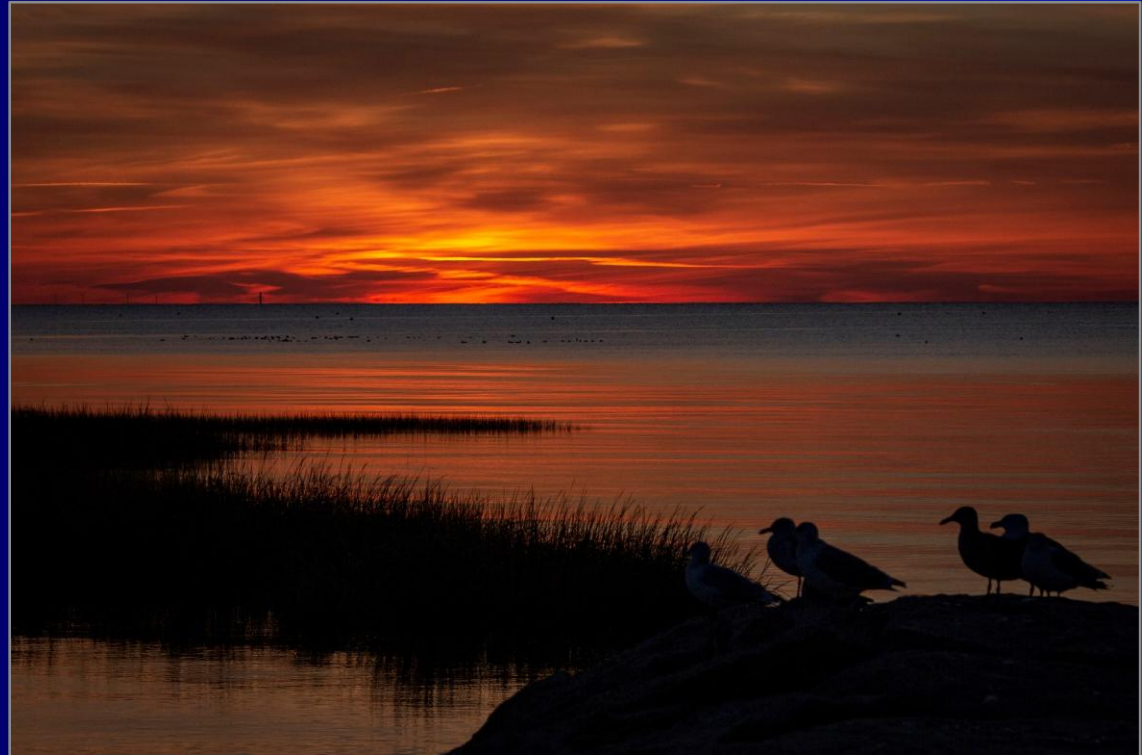

Upon Arrival: Stop at a Visitors Center or Info Rack

Communicating in a Foreign Country

The most important phrase – “Where’s the bathroom?”

Many countries have “Men & Women Diagrams” and signs in English as well!

Learning “hello” in the local language can be helpful!

- Spanish – Hola (o la)
- French – Bonjour (bown zhoor)
- German – Hallo/Guten Tag
- Italian – Ciao (chow)

Where is the bathroom? (Some places charge or want tips.)

- Spanish – ¿Dónde está el baño?
- French, German, Italian – Toilet, Toilette (twa-lette)
- British English, Irish – WC (Water Closet), Loo, Lavatory
- Other names: Latrine, Privy, CR (Comfort Room)

We have “Western Toilets.” Some places have “Squat Toilets” or “Turkish Toilets.” Outside of a hotel, bring toilet paper with you.

Navigating – After You Arrive



Most learn English in school and can speak and understand it better than most older adults.

When all else fails, ask some local young people for help.

Foreign Travel Tips

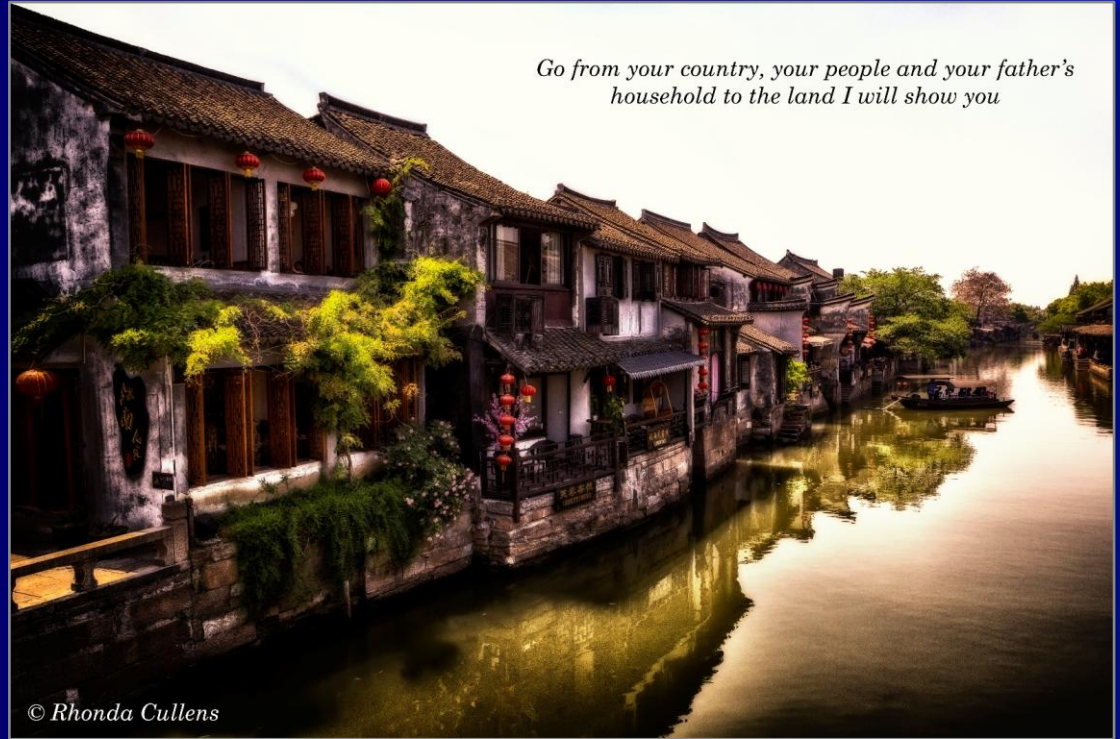
- Bring a passport with at least 6 months of validity left on it when traveling internationally.
- Check the State Department website for any VISA or immunization requirements, travel bans, or cautions.
- Leave a copy of your passport and itinerary with someone back home.
- Take photos on your phone, if password protected, of your passport and both sides of your credit cards.
- Set your phone up to make international calls.
- Check what kind of electrical plugs they use. You might need to bring adapters to plug in your phone and battery chargers as well as other devices.
- Check with a doctor about bringing antibiotics or other medicines with you.
- Credit card - Check if has foreign charges/PIN

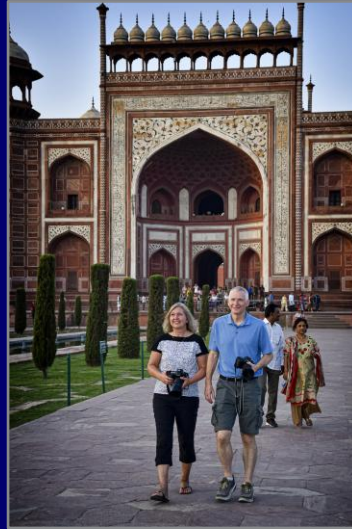
